As I think of all the beautiful objects, events and people that God created, he could not have made for mankind anyone better than **Lucille Juanita Ellison**, my cousin. He put the pedals on flowers, the vocal cords in people, the planets, stars, and the sun in the universe, but he put Lucille on this earth for the benefit of mankind. You were anointed by God and have uplifted his name, revered in his glory throughout your charming life.

As a baby, not even knowing myself, I knew you, Lucille. You were the younger of two children born to the late John Howard Ellison and Mollie Rae Huguely Ellison. It was your parents that kept my mother and me from being on the streets for God willed that they would give us a home, thus starting me out on my life. So it is with reason that you became a sister to me. There are many who to this day think that we are siblings. So let it be, for I can't think of one better to call my sister. I can remember the childhood days of disagreements leading to arguments that normally occur between siblings. More important than that were the favors and the helping hands that were always extended to me.

Then there was the death of your mother that occurred while you were still a youth that catapulted you and your deceased sister, Pauline, into caring for and maintaining a home for your father and me, for my mother had long since become mentally incapacitated. Fortunately, your mother did a splendid job of teaching you how to cook. I can't remember any letup in the quality of prepared food after Aunt Mollie died. I would always long for and still do, the homemade breads, such as biscuits and rolls, that would be so good as they came out the oven. And don't let me forget the pies and cakes. This was a time when without hesitation you actually assumed the responsibility of my mother.

Lucille, you were always there to advise and assist me. I had a small job while attending high school and it was you who continued to advise me to save my earnings. After high school I entered the service and it was you who lifted me up with your letters during my extensive stay in a foreign land. Afterwards you continued to be my adviser, although at this time I was a man almost ready to assume my responsibility as such. After marriage my attention focused on family life; however, you were still there to assist in whatever way you could.

To sum it all up, you were there regardless of my life status. For this I am ever grateful to God that you, Lucille J. Ellison, are part of my life. May God always bless you in a mighty way.
