

A VOICE FROM THE PAST – Amie Frances (Huguely) Gillispie

Amie Frances (Huguely) Gillispie (August 22, 1909 – 2002), the daughter of the late Allena (Hatton) and Stephen Huguely, one of the original founder's and organizer's of the Huguely Family Reunion where she served as the first recording secretary.

On March 10, 1946, Amie married Enoch Gillispie and they had two children: Charley Edward and Albirda Frances.

She consistently reminisced about the old horse-drawn wagons filled with picnic baskets of home cooked fried chicken, corn pudding, green beans, pickled beets, greens, and an assortment of homemade cakes and pies with the majority of the food raised and grown on the farm. Not to mention homemade ice cream and ice in the ice house – water was drawn from a well. These were the 'good ole days' as Momma Amie constantly reminded her grandchildren of "what was good" back in the day. Yes,

these were the 'good ole days' when family members gathered at Aunt Mary Jane Nolan, Pleas and Lila Cavanaugh, and others.

Amie was a trained elementary education teacher, received her bachelor's degree from Kentucky State University, Frankfort, Kentucky. She was an advocate for young people furthering their education and making a difference in the world.

What is Amie's legacy to the Reunion? A love of family, specifically, a love of the Huguely Family Reunion. It is in her honor and memory that the Gillispie family started the Amie Frances Huguely Gillispie Scholarship Endowment Fund.
