I'm **James Cornelison**, age 83 and 8 months, happy to be the oldest member of the above named branch. Last year it was **Alice**, my wife, who had a date with the surgeon for arthroscopic right knee surgery in July. She's about 98% healed from that adventure. I hear it takes a year for people to completely get over having surgery, unless it's for a little thing like having your tonsils removed. I'm real sensitive about how long it takes to get over surgery because from May 31 to June 27, 2014 I spent a total of 25 days in the hospital, the second time for a very serious small bowel obstruction caused by adhesions from the abdominal surgery I had 10 years ago when Alice and I were vacationing in South Carolina visiting friends.

I don't want to hear anything about the Intensive Care Unit, respirator, nasogastric tube, hyperalimentation feedings, heparin drips, blood tests several times a day, atrial fibrillation, pain, and awful, awful, awful hospital food from a single soul. Been there, done that, and want to keep it way behind me. I'm grateful to God for all the prayers, cards, phone calls and visits I received while at the hospital. The staples have been removed and I am a witness that God is still in the healing business big time. I'll be mending for months. The surgeon said

that I am not to go to the gym for my three times a week workouts on the treadmill and heavy weights machines or I may cause a hernia and she will have to take me back to surgery. Stairs are also limited because of the pressure put on the abdominal muscles. I am stronger each day. By the time you see me I should be standing tall and walking with a nice stride for an "old fella."

Timing is everything. **Alice** and I were to be on a road trip from Ellicott City, Maryland, to Cincinnati, to Indianapolis, to Chicago and then home. Instead, I was in the hospital. **Alice's** 60th high school reunion was in Indianapolis June 6 and 7. **Alice's** Crispus Attucks High School class of 1954 has been tightly held-together with newsletters four times a year and celebrations of their 40th, 50th, 54th, and 60 reunions. Daughter **Terri** and "nephew," **Kenneth Cobb** (of the Everee Huguely and Green Gentry Branch) strongly encouraged Alice to fly to Indianapolis rather than to miss her class reunion. Daughter **Erin** drove down from Chicago to fill my seat at their banquet. **Alice** received a surprise award from the reunion's president, recognized as a dedicated and valued member of the Class of 1954 for all the encouragement and support she gave from a distance.

The rest of the family sends warm greetings to the reunion. Daughter **Erin Cornelison** enjoys working and living in Chicago. Enoch Gillispie Served as a Combat Engineer under General Patton

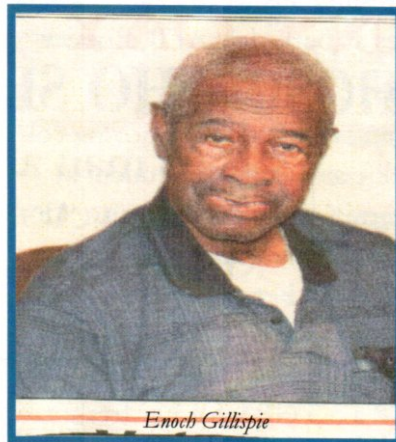
Enoch Gillispie grew up on Flatwoods Road in Garrard County, KY and is proud to say he served with the U.S. Army Combat Engineers during WWII under Gen. George S. Patton Jr. In 1938, **Gillispie** was working for the Civilian Conservation Corps, a Depression-era program intended to employ young men in public improvement projects. With the CCC, he helped build an air base in Elgin, Florida.

When he enlisted in the Army after the war began, **Gillispie** trained at Fort Dix in New Jersey. Then he was sent for more than six months to Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis, where he helped train soldiers to march. One night, when the men were camped out in pup tents, a heavy snow fell. Covered in snow, the tents resembled a graveyard the next morning. The sergeants had to blow whistles to wake the men from the cold and quiet, he recalls.

Gillispie was transported to Europe on the ocean liner Queen Elizabeth. However, he remembers one troop transport was torpedoed during the crossing, sinking the ship and killing all the men aboard. **Gillispie's** unit served

across.

When his unit ran out of gasoline at the Rhine River, the audacious Patton had some of his men put on police uniforms and seize the fuel for the vehicles. **Gillispie's** unit had the grim task of burying the victims of a Nazi death camp, digging a mass grave 300 feet long. Jews

and other Nazis considered undesirable were loaded onto trucks after being told they were going to work camps, he said. Instead they were taken to camps where they were murdered in gas chambers.

The Army trained **Gillispie** to operate excavating equipment, including bulldozers and steam-powered equipment. On one assignment in France, he was ordered to dig a hole 20 feet wide and 20 feet deep on a farm to bury a crashed Allied airplane so it wouldn't fall into German hands. Useable parts were taken off the plane, and **Gillispie** learned that it was discovered six or seven years after the war. Retreating German soldiers sometimes left their food rations behind, and the American soldiers would eat them. Some of it was labeled horse meat, but the soldiers soon learned it was beef liver. **Gillispie** helped build an air base in Frankfurt, Germany, that is still in use, he said. Part of his job was to construct an earthen bank 100 feet long and 25 feet high to protect fighter planes.

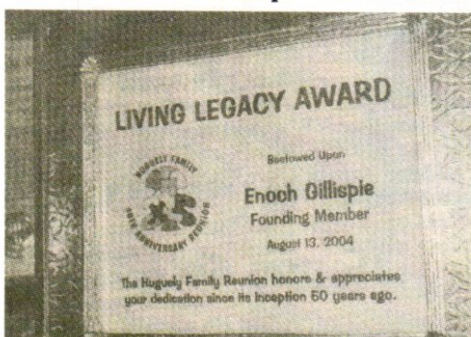
One day, he stopped his bulldozer

and paused as he was driving it down a hill. When asked why, he said he stopped because he could hear "my grandmother saying a prayer for me." Later in the war, **Gillispie** was wounded in the lower part of his legs where he still has shrapnel, and was awarded the Purple Heart. He spent more than five years in the service, most of it overseas. Although the war was terrible, he has no regrets about serving his country. If America hasn't helped defeat the Nazis, "We wouldn't be living here today with the freedom we have," he said. **Gillispie's** father had served in World War I, and both his brothers also served their country in the military as he did. **Shelton Gillispie** was in the Army, and **Willie Gillispie** served with the Navy. **Gillispie** is a member of the Ashlar Lodge No. 49, and was honored last year for more than 50 years of service to the lodge. He allowed the lodge to raise tobacco on his land to help finance construction of its building on Francis Street. Although he was trained and experienced in the use of heavy equipment, employers would not hire an African American for that kind of work. So he took a job as a laborer.

Gillispie married after leaving the service, and he and his late wife (**Amie**) had two children. His son (**Charley**) lives in Indiana, and his daughter (**Albirda**) in Richmond. He has a grandson (**Chris**) who is a lawyer, and a grand daughter (**Adel**) who is a nurse.

Former Chief Financial Officer Charley Gillispie Uses His Retirement to Give Back

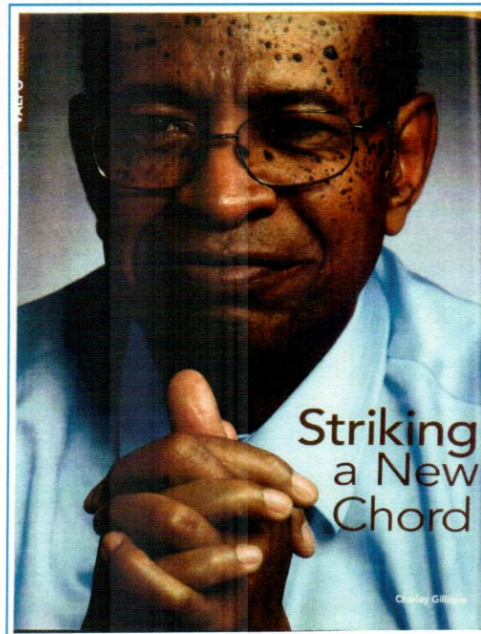
Charley Gillispie's retirement from his post as the chief financial officer of Valparaiso University in July 2013 was the end of a chapter filled with hard work that defied expectations, but it certainly won't be the end of **Gillispie's** story at Valpo.

Even though **Gillispie** has retired, Valparaiso will still be his home. He is serving as a special assistant to the president and working with minority and first-generation college students in a program he has tentatively titled "Mentoring for Success."

The opportunity, he said, is a chance to share what he's learned in his climb to the top.

"People look at me, and because I've been the CFO and the first African American partner in an accounting firm, they think I was born with a silver spoon," he said. But **Gillispie's** story is much more complex. **Gillispie** grew up in Kentucky in the 1950s. His mother had

a college degree, but his father never finished eighth grade. Unable to attend the "whites-only" school just down the road from his home because of racial segregation, **Gillispie**



took an hour-long bus ride to school.

He remembers not being allowed to dine with his white colleagues at the A&P grocery store where he worked as a teenager. And even after he'd graduated from Eastern Kentucky University and began working for an accounting firm, **Gillispie** would only be allowed to take on clients after his boss had called to be sure

those clients were "comfortable working with an African American."

In spite of these inequities, **Gillispie** maintained his work ethic and refused to let racism stand in his way.

Eventually, he became a partner of the accounting firm. Then he went on to serve as the chief financial officer of the Chicago Public Schools and, for the past 17 years, as the CFO at Valparaiso University.

"We like to think that we bring students to Valpo, and the ground is equal," **Gillispie** said. "But it's not an equal playing field. When your parents have not been to college, they can't help you as you try to navigate a career and or tell you what you need to do."

Gillispie continued, "For first-generation college students and multicultural students, an education is a way to the future. Access is not enough. We must see that they have

success."

The "Mentoring for Success" program is designed to help students gain a better understanding of what success looks like. For instance, **Gillispie** said, "students who don't come from professional families often don't know the importance of networking."

"Especially for our minority students, quite often I think they look at a job and think, 'I'll get the job, and then I can separate myself.'"

Gillispie explained. "But in order to move up, people around you have to get to know you. People like to work with people they know:"

In addition, **Gillispie** wants to use Valpo's network of successful alumni to connect first-generation students to people who are already established in their careers. Recently he met an engineering student who said she dreams of being a patent attorney but was struggling to find information about how to get into such a career. **Gillispie** called some

friends he knew at local law firms to put her in touch with someone already in the field.

"The best way to prepare students adequately to know what to expect is to put them in touch with people

who can talk with them about what it's like to transition from college into their career," he explained. "It's important to make contact with people who've been out in the business world as professionals."

Though **Gillispie** has only been in this new role for a few months, he's excited about the connections he's making on campus, and he believes the mentoring program can make a

real, tangible difference for multicultural and first-generation students.

"I had to work very hard to get where I am," **Gillispie** said. "I want to be able to give back and do anything that I can do to help make the playing field more equal for those who follow:"

After he moved to Maryland, he looked for a similar organization, but could not find one. The primary mission of the group is fundraising in order to provide music scholarships to Baltimore metropolitan area youth.



In the fall of 2010, the group was reorganized under the baton of **Hugh W. Carey**, who brings a new kind of vitality and spirit to this group of talented men. The participants of the group come from a variety of backgrounds. 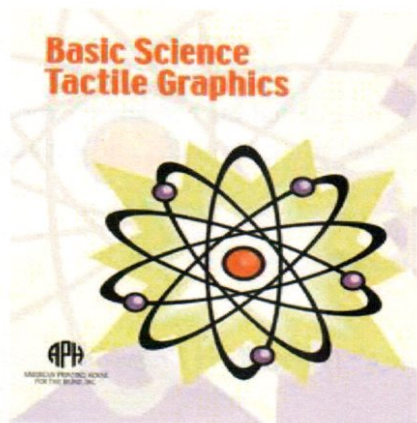

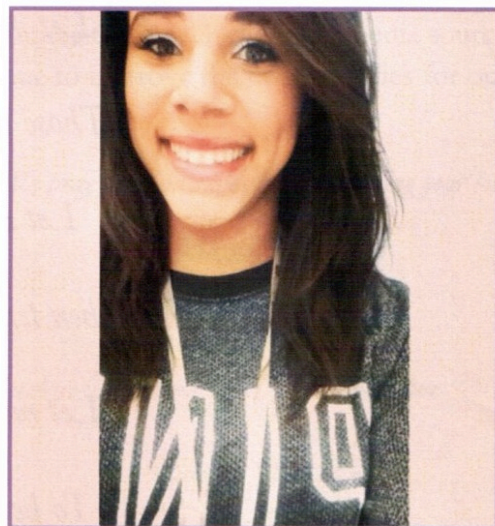

This joyous gathering was the celebration of their 50th Wedding Anniversary.

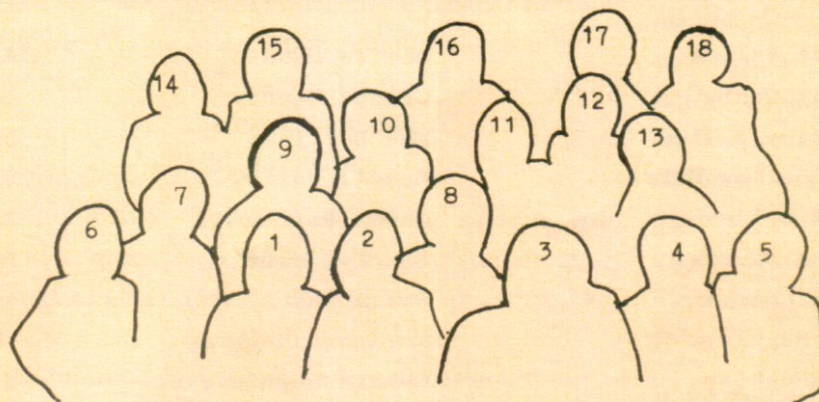
George Huguely was made the Honorary President when the Huguely Reunion was organized in 1954.

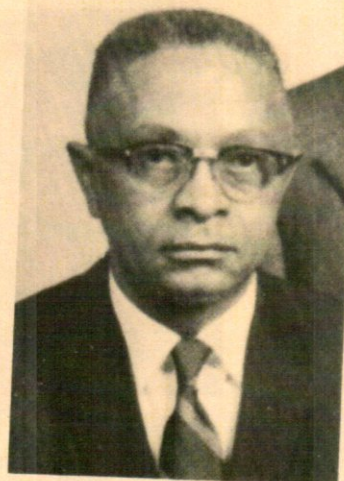

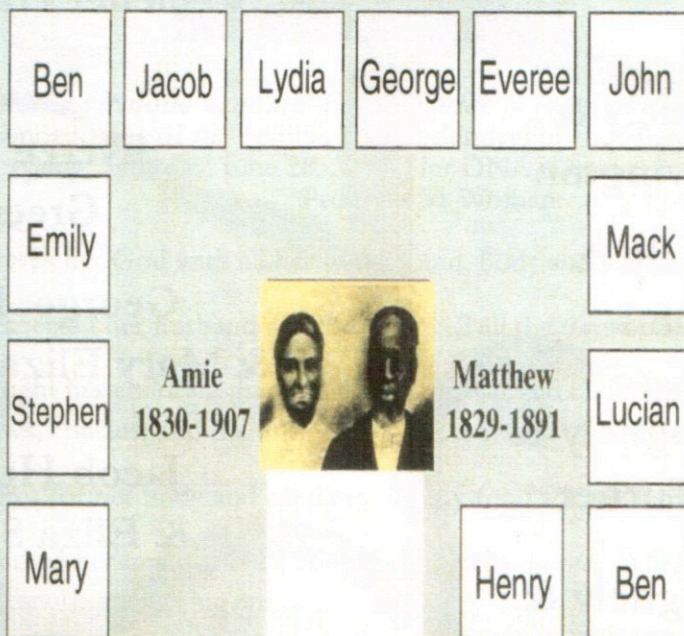
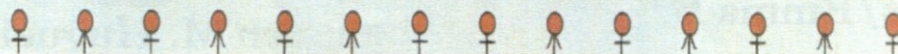
