

Increase Scholarship GPA Requirement

Proposal

The Huguely Reunion Scholarships are only available to undergraduates attending a 2 or 4 year accredited college/ university.

Eligibility requirements:

- Related to the Huguely Reunion Family by blood or/and legal adoption.
- Is an active member of the Huguely Reunion.
- High school graduates and previously enrolled college/ university students must achieve a minimum **2.5 grade point average on 4.0 scale** and must have been accepted to an approved and accredited institution.

(recommendation: **(Change: minimum GPA 2.7)**)

- Enrolled in undergraduate college/university courses as a full time student.

- Graduate students are not eligible to apply.

- Participate in the Huguely Reunion Career and College Mentoring Program for Youth and Young Adults. **(addition)**

Background / History

- The Huguely Reunion Scholarship Program was established to provide assistance (e.g., college tuition, room, board, books) to eligible high school seniors and undergraduate college students of the Reunion.
- The ideal of providing scholarships for youth was the dream of Amie Frances Huguely Gillispie, Stephen & Allena Huguely branch of the Reunion.
- Toni Miles, Lucian Huguely Huguely branch, provided the seed money for the Scholarship program in _____.
- In 2002, the late Amie Frances Gillispie Endowment Fund was established in her name, monies in excess of 10K are used to help support applicants who meet scholarship requirements.
- Graduate students are not eligible to apply for scholarships.

Justification

- Time to re-evaluate the Scholarship requirements and application process
- Most institutions require a GPA of 3.0 for admissions and scholarships or other awards
- Applicants applying for Scholarship monies, to date, all meet or/and exceed the minimum GPA requirement

Benefits / Impact

- Scholarship process would be more competitive
- More monies available per applicant
- Less applicants applying for monies
- **RECOMMENDATION**
- **Present GPA requirement remain at 2.5 on 4.0 grade scale**
