President's Greetings


Hello Huguely Family,


We've come a long way by faith and determination to honor the legacy of Amie Keene Huguely and Matthew Huguely. From overloaded picnic baskets on long tables in the barn, with our elders sitting up front, to this year's annual gathering of committed relatives, I'm so happy to be a part of this dynamic reunion.

I am Jim Cornelison, 85 $\frac{3}{4}$ years old. Our very grown children continue to thrive in their various professions: Terri Cornelison and Jetty Viot in Maryland; Michael and Carol Cornelison in Pennsylvania; and Erin Cornelison in Illinois. They make us proud that God blesses them daily and that they are faithful in their faiths.

The 60th Anniversary's Newsletter in 2014 included a story about the Baltimore Regional Community Male Chorus (BRCMC) that I founded in 1979. Under the phenomenal leadership of Hugh Carey, Director, the choir of 20 gifted voices has just come out with its first CD. The repertoire includes standard traditional choral music, anthems, Negro spirituals, gospel, contemporary pop, Broadway show tunes, folksongs, "pop soul" and patriotic songs. Our group is a non-profit 501(c)(3) choral organization and I have copies with me just for you.

Knowing that our current reunion President—very attentive nephew, Kenneth Alexander Cobb, has included lots of news about our branch since the last reunion, I won't repeat those news bits here: the ones about my wife, Alice's, total knee replacement, and our 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ year-old granddaughter, Carrington Viot, at her princess birthday party. Carrington has sung her first solo at Agape A.M.E. Church. On June 19th, she received a certificate for "reading an entire book before going to bed, learning math and doing simple addition, improved Frisbee throwing skills, and saving pennies in her bear bank for college." Kenny also reported about our 15-year-old grandson, Jason Cornelison, and his track awards (like his dad, Michael Cornelison and his aunt, Erin Cornelison in their own high school and collegiate track successes). Plus, there was an outstanding surprise Sunday afternoon visit in June by Vicki and Lauren Mitchell (John A. Huguely & Emma Ballew Branch), who were in Baltimore for a Fantasia concert that night.

You all know that Kenneth is really a cousin from the Everee Huguely and Green Gentry Branch, but because of our age difference, he has always



respectfully called us Uncle Jim and Aunt Alice, and has his six siblings doing the same. Because of his generosity, there are few live jazz or theatrical performances in the Baltimore-Washington area, mostly with African-American themes, that we don't get a chance to accompany him. Kenneth buys all the tickets. And the transportation to these events is super—he lets us out and picks us up at the door, plus comes around to the car's doors, opens them and sees that we safely get in or get out. We, along with our wonderful family friend, Theresa Jackson, LOVED seeing the UniverSoul Circus at National Harbor, Maryland. Afterwards, we enjoyed lunch at the Redstone American Grill on the waterfront, then drove past the new MGM Casino (under construction) and shopped briefly at the Tanger Outlet. (National Harbor is one of next year's Huguely Reunion WDC tourist attractions.) His beloved parents, Emma and Dumas Cobb, taught him manners that make us appreciative, safe, and happy.

After announcing in this newsletter in 2011 and 2015 that Alice was seriously discarding the accumulations of stuff from over 50 years of married life, I have to say that now in 2016, she has actually started—discarding books, pictures, obituaries, letters, shoes, greeting cards, pots and pans, flower vases, financial and medical records going back six decades, and clothes that are too out of style to give to any agency. Kenneth takes trunkloads of stuff to Goodwill and the landfill. Long ago Alice gave Terri, Michael, and Erin a large manila envelope of report cards, pictures, drawings, etc. that parents collect over years of childhood adventures. In addition, she has started on every drawer in the house that is not mine, dumping contents on the bed so she has to clear the clutter before going to bed. It's amazing what the hidden nooks and crannies in a house can hold over decades of placing things out of sight. Last Christmas, she gave away or threw out old Christmas decorations, some as old as I am, that belonged to my Aunt Mollie Huguely and Uncle John Ashley, who raised me in Cincinnati. Alice is eyeing my tools and cans of this-and-that in the garage so I know that little by little they will disappear too. I'm glad she's finally doing what she's been talking about for years so she'll stop talking about it—removing unnecessary stuff and keeping those cleaned-out spaces empty.

I am sorry to report that I had a bad fall at home in June. My legs gave out and I hit the wood floor hard, and banged my head against the wall. The CT scans at the emergency room showed that I had a subdural hematoma, which is a bleeding in the space between the brain covering and the skull. I didn't remember the fall until the doctors said that I slammed my head pretty hard. I was discharged two days later after follow-up CT scans of the head showed no progression of the bleeding. I had another CT scan on July 15th and will learn in a few days if the doctors will let me start driving again and returning to the gym where I go three times a week to walk the treadmill, lift weights, and chat with folks.

We are delighted that cousins Donna Harris and her son Eric of our Mack Huguely and Millie Turner Branch have come to the reunion this year from Cincinnati. Donna has not attended since she was a little girl and I believe this is Eric's second trip. Donna's mother was Pauline Ashley, a faithful annual reunion attendee for decades. Pauline's sister was Lucille Ellison, past president of the Huguely Family Reunion and author of the Reunion Song. God called both of these hard-working Cincinnati reunion members to glory some years ago. We are also pleased that daughter Erin Cornelison of Chicago is flying to this year's reunion as she did last year when we were in Lexington, KY. We knew she was serious about coming when she went to Eileen Fisher to buy a white dress!



My wife of 58 years, Alice, is now an octogenarian, having celebrated her 80th birthday on July 8th. Kenny had arranged for a gathering of 25 family and friends at her favorite restaurant, Cheesecake Factory, for July 9th (the three enclosed photos). Alice is kept happy by planned busyness, quality relaxation, wonderful longtime friendships, her family, not worrying about the small stuff, and living her deep faith in God. She loves reading books across a broad spectrum of interests, including ones about the Gullah people in the Sea Islands of the South, and ethical issues in healthcare. Her current book love is "The American Slave Coast: A History of the Slave-Breeding Industry" by Ned & Constance Sublette. In addition, the 2016 Juneteenth Celebration in Howard County, Maryland, included her talk with photographs depicting how the county's black community celebrated life in spite of segregation from post slavery through the 1960s. One activity she is faithful about is taking Mondays as her day off: no cooking dinner (leftovers from Sunday), no meetings or medical appointments, no dusting or washing dishes—nothing unless she initiates it herself.

In closing, let me share this personal thought: Every day is a day of thanksgiving for me. I pause and yell, "Thank you, God," for all He blesses me with: family, friends, church, and a large portion of good health. I have no pain anywhere in my body. I'm slower than I used to be, but nothing hurts. I stay "cool, calm, and collected," and give thanks each day for that day's portion of blessings.




say, Jason was quite hungry and thirsty, and ate well! The food was great!!!




TODD & MAURIETA (EDMONSON) WASHAM FAMILY

Our youngest daughter, Dominique, has made the President’s List for the fourth straight semester.






Thank you for your continuous support and believing that I can and should take part in such an extraordinary experience.






Also, in mid-April, Garry Reid, III, traveled to




JANIKA (MORTON) BLAMO FAMILY







Become a Freelancer



I remember joining the Hugueley family 41 years ago, recalling business meetings with senior family discussing the good old days and how things were years ago. Many of those family members are deceased, now I find myself – a senior – retired with words of wisdom for the young folks. Charley and I had to conserve and follow a conservative PLAN OF ACTION so Do NOT fall into these Blunders.

Today's 65-year-olds can expect to spend about 20 years in retirement should they quit their jobs right now. However, the Social Security Administration reports that one quarter of those who are age 65 today will reach age 90, and 10 percent will make it past age 95.

Those numbers add up to a lot of time spent living off retirement savings. If you want to be comfortable during those years, REVIEW and avoid these 10 retirement blunders listed below.

Blunder No. 1: Not having a plan for retirement money.

Retirement planning experts say the biggest blunder workers make is simply not having a plan for their money in retirement.

Blunder No. 2: Forgetting about inflation when making a plan.

Another mistake people make is forgetting that a dollar today isn't the same as a dollar 20 years from now. Inflation can erode purchasing power and needs to be calculated into a cash flow scenario or retirement plan.

Blunder No. 3: Failing to save enough money for retirement.

Of course, the best plan in the world can't compensate for a retirement account with scant money in it.

Blunder No. 4: Raiding retirement accounts early.

While loans can be taken from 401(k) accounts and IRA money can be withdrawn early for certain needs, like educational expenses, doing so is a mistake. That money needs to stay in those accounts to accumulate compound interest, which has the potential to add tens of thousands of dollars or more to an account balance over the course of a career.

Blunder No. 5: Getting emotional about investments.

Another retirement blunder is poor investment behavior.

Blunder No. 6: Being too conservative in investments.

Investor returns may also lag behind benchmarks like the S&P 500 because people are too conservative with their money. Retired investors need enough growth in their funds to keep up with inflation and stretch money over what could potentially be a 30-year retirement.

Blunder No. 7: Missing an employer's 401(k) match.

Not meeting the minimum contribution to qualify for your employer's minimum match is like refusing part of your pay.

Blunder No. 8: Letting all retirement money be taxable.

It's a mistake to not take advantage of retirement accounts that can ensure some of your money is tax-free later in life.

Blunder No. 9: Underestimating health care expenses.

Medical care can be a major expense in retirement and one that is frequently overlooked.

To avoid this retirement blunder, pre-retirees should [review their Medicare options carefully](#) to decide whether a Medicare Advantage plan or original Medicare combined with a Medigap policy will provide the best benefits now and in the years to come.

Blunder No. 10: Filing for Social Security too early.

A final common blunder involves taking Social Security benefits too early. While retirees can [begin benefits as early as age 62](#), their monthly amount will be lower than what they could receive if they waited until their full retirement age, which is 66 for those retiring this year. Waiting past your full retirement age can reap additional benefits, too.



Married retirees can coordinate spousal benefits to maximize their Social Security. Single retirees may be able to use other sources of retirement income, such as pensions or IRAs, to delay claiming Social Security benefits.

PRESTIGE – No one recognizes you anymore, you are just another person in the crowd.





She is transferring to Kennesaw State University in the fall of 2016 where she will continue to pursue a





Purpose: The Huguely Reunion Scholarship Program was established to provide college tuition assistance to eligible high school seniors and undergraduate college students of the Reunion.


Scholarship Amount: The scholarship award is to be used for tuition assistance at an approved and accredited institution.

- The student is an active member of the Huguely Reunion.
- For recent high school graduates, the student must achieve a minimum 2.5 grade point average and must have been accepted to an approved and accredited institution.
- The student has been previously enrolled in college/university and has achieved a minimum 2.5 grade point average on a 4.0 scale and must have been accepted to an approved and accredited institution.
- The student is enrolled in undergraduate college courses. Graduate students are not eligible.
- The student is enrolled as a full time college student.
- The student must agree to participate in the Huguely Reunion Career and College Mentoring Program for Youth and Young Adults.


First Secretary of the Huguely Family Reunion
