
MIYA ROSS





On November 22, 2016, three Huguely family members and three of their best friends had the honor and privilege to visit the new National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC) in Washington, D.C. The museum, strategically located on the National Mall in close proximity to the Washington Monument, is the only national museum devoted exclusively to the documentation of African American life, history, and culture. To date, it has collected more than 36,000 artifacts for display. The NMAAHC opened to the public on September 24, 2016, as the 19th and newest museum of the Smithsonian Institution. Fortunately, Alice Cornelison was able to procure six free timed passes a few months in advance for that day.

Levels 2, 3, and 4 above ground feature historical exhibits, artifacts, and displays for media, culture, and entertainment, respectively. Very exciting stuff!!! The Concourse, which includes three levels below ground of historic galleries and covers the transatlantic slave trade from 1450 to the mid-1900s through the civil rights period, is very thorough and moving. The Concourse also includes a massive spiral staircase from the lobby, the Oprah Winfrey Theater, and a café.





Even though the small group arrived for its 11:00 A.M. start time and departed just after 4:00 P.M., it could've easily stayed until the 5:30 P.M. closing time perusing the many outstanding and thought-provoking exhibits.
