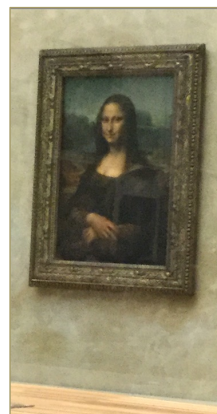

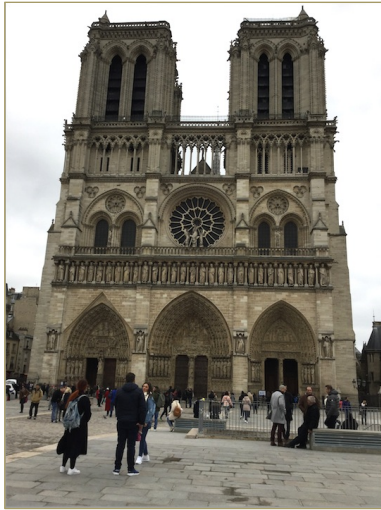

DR. TERRI CORNELISON

On April 17, 2017, after more than 23 years with the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Dr. Terri Cornelison, wife of Jetty Viot and mother of Carrington, began her new job at the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), located in Silver Spring, Maryland, as Assistant Director for the Health of Women, Office of the Center Director, Centers for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH). The CDRH Health of Women program seeks to bring together clinicians, researchers, academia, government agencies, industry, and patient/advocacy groups in an effort to foster development of devices that best meet the needs of women; develop device-specific clinical study strategies; improve analysis and communication of sex-specific findings to providers and patients; and develop a priority research roadmap for the device Health of Women ecosystem.



This new Assistant Director position was primarily developed to strengthen CDRH's response to Section 907 of the Food and Drug Administration Safety and Innovation Act (FDASIA) Action Plan for collecting and reporting sex-based and gender-based differences. Terri will also have the responsibility to lead a new Health of Women framework to explore some of the unique issues related to the performance of medical devices in women, and address priority issues, including:

- Improving the availability, consistency and communication of sex-specific information for the safe and effective use of medical devices in women
- Addressing identified gaps and unmet needs through targeted resources
- Fostering the development of innovative strategies, technology and clinical study paradigms



Despite hitting the road running, getting up to speed on her new responsibilities, Terri will continue to perform her long-running 'clinic' on Fridays as Associate Professor of Obstetrics & Gynecology at Johns Hopkins University, School of Medicine, located in Baltimore, Maryland, including surgery on cancer patients and classroom instruction to medical students. 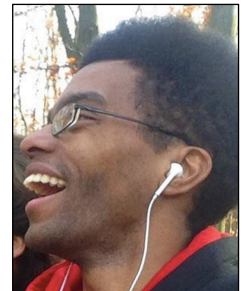
JEREMY COBB

Miya is currently a 10th grader at Renaissance High School in Detroit, Michigan. The SEA is a collection of summertime programs for middle and high school students that introduce them to engineering disciplines through exciting real-world challenges. SEA is offered by the U-M Center for Engineering Diversity and Outreach (CEDO).



The 13-day MITE program will be from July 10-22, 2017, and students will reside in on-campus housing. Only 40 students were accepted into this program, which excites, engages, educates, and empowers students with an integrated curriculum centering on an engineering-based challenge. Students attend four key academic classes: Engineering Concepts, Technical Communications, Engineering Math, and Professional Development. These classes support the engineering design challenge. Students will also participate in workshops on

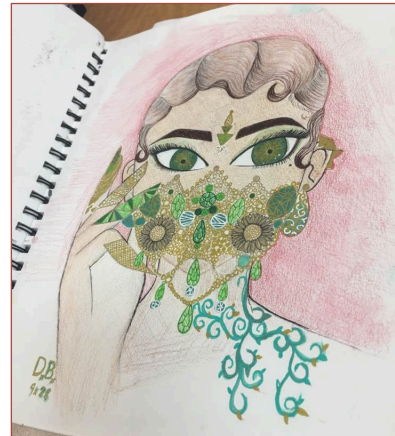

On April 7, 2017, Dezarae Boyd, oldest daughter of Janika Morton-Blamo, was accepted into the University of Michigan (U-M) Penny W. Stamps School of Art & Design (A&D) six-week spring after-school program for pre-college students (9th thru 12th graders). Dezarae, an aspiring and talented artist in her own right, is currently a 9th grader at Washtenaw International High School (WIHI) in Ypsilanti, Michigan, a public consortium institution that offers an International Baccalaureate diploma as well as a High School diploma. Even more amazing is that she was also awarded (and blessed with) a full scholarship to attend the program!!!



U-M's A&D School, established in 1974 and renamed the Stamps School in 2012, is one of its 19 schools and colleges and is fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD). Stamps academic programs and projects focus on generating new creative work, integrating the cultures of art and design, and engaging with the University, regional, national, and international communities.

For the six-week *Portfolio Intensive: Drawing for Artists & Designers* program, students learn drawing concepts fundamental to contemporary art and design practice, and gain knowledge and experience in a variety of approaches ranging from observational to experimental drawing. Each class session is structured as studio-drawing time, giving students ample opportunity to build their drawing skills and apply new concepts. Lectures, demonstrations, handouts, and slides enhance covered material. Classes meet twice a week for 2.5 hours. Congrats, Dezarae!!!



Also, on March 11-12, 2017, Dezarae's school, WIHI, competed with over 40 local high schools in the Muslim Inter-Scholastic Tournament (MIST) Detroit, a unique educational interactive program of competitions and workshops geared towards bringing high school students together from around the nation to develop leadership, communication, and other creative skills, all while gaining a deeper understanding of Islam and Muslims. Competition categories (events) included: Knowledge and Quran (12), Arts (7), Writing and Oratory (5), Bracket Competitions (8), Group Projects (7), and Sports (4). Although Dezarae competed in the Arts (Fashion Design) category but did not place, WIHI won the Top Overall Team ranking!!! The MIST Nationals, where the top three-five individuals in each event from 15 U.S. regions and Toronto come together to compete, will be held in July in Detroit.

Finally, on April 29, 2017, Dezarae was recognized for her achievement this past academic year in the Inkster, Michigan Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. The program is designed to motivate, engage, and assist female and male high school students in reaching their maximum potential, with emphasis placed on SMART (Science, Math, and Related Technologies) careers.
