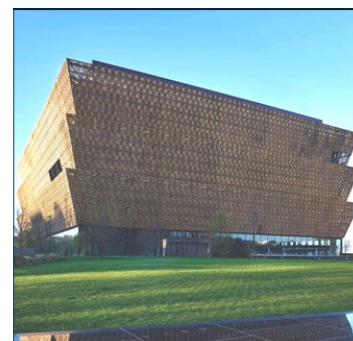

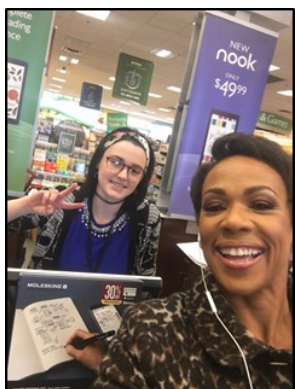

On November 22, 2016, Jim and Alice, three of their best friends, and Kenneth had the honor and privilege to visit the new National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC) in Washington, D.C. The museum, strategically located on the National Mall in close proximity to the Washington Monument, is the only national museum devoted exclusively to the documentation of African American life, history, and culture. To date, it has collected more than 36,000 artifacts for display. The NMAAHC opened to the public on September 24, 2016, as the 19th and newest museum of the Smithsonian Institution. Fortunately, Alice was able to procure six free timed passes a few months in advance for that day.

Levels 2, 3, and 4 above ground feature historical exhibits, artifacts, and displays for media, culture, and entertainment, respectively. Very exciting stuff!!! The Concourse, which comprises three levels below ground of historic galleries and covers the transatlantic slave trade from 1450 to the mid-1900s through the civil rights period, is very thorough and moving. The Concourse also includes a massive spiral staircase from

the lobby, the Oprah Winfrey Theater, and a café.

Even though the small group arrived for its 11:00 A.M. start time and departed just after 4:00 P.M., it could’ve easily stayed until the 5:30 P.M. closing time perusing the many outstanding and thought-provoking exhibits. Definitely, a “must-see” historical museum! And the group was more than happy to perform a dry run on behalf of the Huguely Family in advance of this summer’s Huguely Reunion.

Afterwards, needing time to relax and get off their feet, as well as to avoid WDC rush-hour traffic, a very nice sit-down dinner was thoroughly

On January 26, 2017, James and Alice saw New York-based American Ballet

Unfortunately, she did not perform that evening, as she was scheduled for two other *Swan Lake* performances that week at the Kennedy Center. Nevertheless, Alice and James thoroughly enjoyed the two-hour, 45-minute nearly sold-out performance. Oh well,

On Sunday, June 25th, during the Baltimore Regional Community (BRC) Male Chorus's Annual Spring Concert at Lochearn Presbyterian Church in Baltimore,

presenting several concerts throughout the year, its primary mission includes fundraising in order to provide a full music scholarship to a Baltimore high school student attending



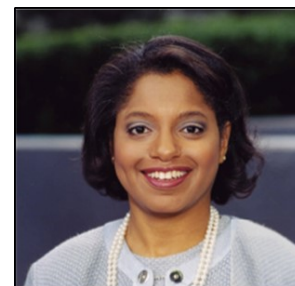

Congratulations to Terri Cornelison, M.D., Ph.D., a gynecologic oncologist, as well as wife of Jetty Viot and mother of Carrington, who, effective December 1, 2016, was named "Associate Professor of Obstetrics & Gynecology" at Johns Hopkins University, School of

Medicine, located in Baltimore, Maryland. Gynecologic oncologists specialize in diagnosing and treating tumors of the female reproductive tract, including the ovaries, fallopian tubes, uterus, cervix, vagina, and vulva. They also specialize in complex benign gynecologic surgery, including procedures for advanced-stage endometriosis, fibroids, ovarian and uterine masses, risk-reducing surgery to prevent

gynecologic cancers.

Terri, who graduated from Yale Medical School, had worked (and continued) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center for 23 years, located in Bethesda, Maryland, and was Associate Director for Clinical Research in the Office of Research on Women's Health. She has performed her 'clinic' on Fridays at Johns Hopkins for 18 years, including surgery on cancer patients and classroom instruction to medical students. This promotion from Assistant Professor was

in recognition of her outstanding performance and dedication at Johns Hopkins over these many years. For this, the Huguely family proudly applauds 'Dr. Terri's' stellar achievement!!!

Then on April 17th, after more than 23 Terri began her new job at the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), a different federal agency altogether, located in Silver Spring, Maryland, as Assistant Director for the Health of Women, Office of the Center Director, Centers for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH). The CDRH Health of Women program seeks to bring together clinicians, researchers, academia, government agencies, industry, and patient/advocacy groups in an effort to foster development of devices that best meet the needs of women; develop device-specific clinical study strategies; improve analysis and communication of sex-specific findings to providers and patients; and develop a priority research roadmap for the device Health of Women ecosystem.

This new Assistant Director position was primarily developed to strengthen CDRH's response to Section 907 of the Food and Drug Administration Safety and

Innovation Act (FDASIA) Action Plan for collecting and reporting sex-based and gender-based differences. Terri will also have the responsibility to lead a new Health of Women framework



to explore some of the unique issues related to the performance of medical devices in women, and address priority issues, including:

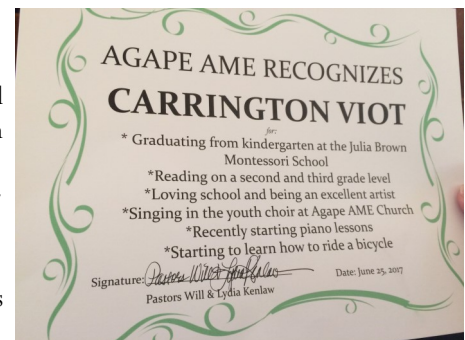
- Improving the availability, consistency and communication of sex-specific information for the safe and effective use of medical devices in women
- Addressing identified gaps and unmet needs through targeted resources



- Fostering the development of innovative strategies, technology and clinical study paradigms

Despite hitting the road running, getting up to speed on her new responsibilities, Terri will continue to perform her long-running 'clinic' on Fridays at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. Onward and upward, Dr. Cornelison!!!

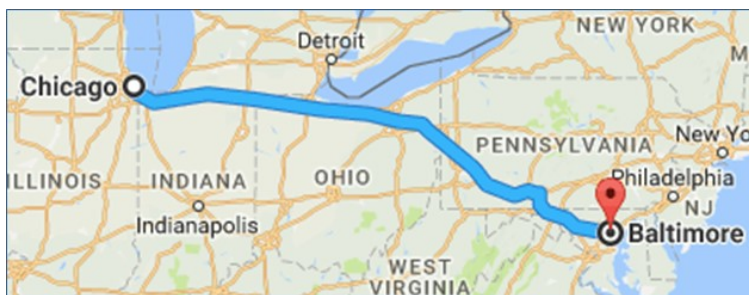
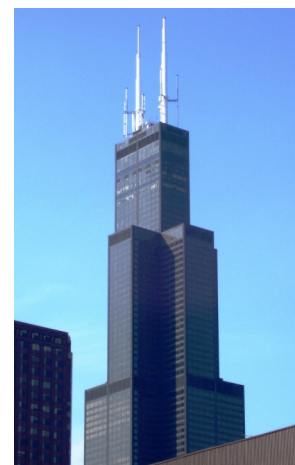
(NOT!!!), but is much more excited about rediscovering Maryland and its many changes over these past 30 years, as well as its new offerings.

On March 11th - 12th, Dezaræ's school, WIHI, competed with over 40 local high schools in the Muslim Inter-Scholastic Tournament (MIST)

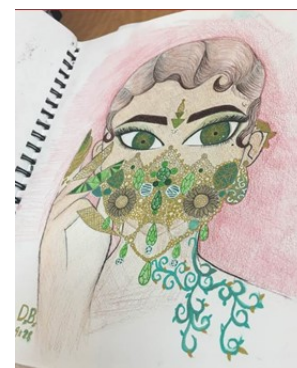
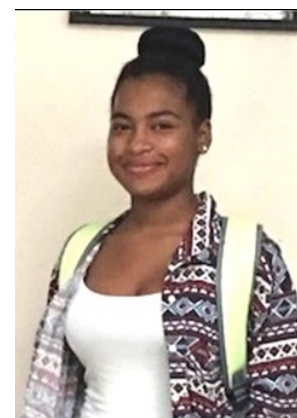

“A Postcard From Central Europe” From across the North Atlantic Ocean comes word that Jeremy Cobb, son of Dr. Marcus and Jennifer Cobb, spent his fall semester in Brno, Czech Republic, as part of an exchange program. Jeremy is in his second year of a three-year

program at the Rose Bruford College of Theatre & Performance, London, England’s international drama school,



which will culminate in a Bachelor of Arts Degree in American Theatre Arts. The pictures on this page (top to bottom) are: Belvedere Palace in Vienna, Austria; Brno Natural History Museum; Brno Opera House; and Prague Castle at sunset.

Jeremy’s school typically sends students to America for their second year, however, he was allowed to go to Brno instead because he’s an American and has already attended an American university. Jeremy wasn’t sure what to expect from the city and culture when he arrived, but he was pleasantly surprised by how modern the city was and how friendly the people were. Brno is a combination of ancient European



architecture with modern stores and facilities inside. There were all kinds of restaurants: Czech food, Chinese food, KFC, McDonald’s, Starbucks, pizza places, burger places, kebab places, and even multiple vegan restaurants. The people were extremely kind and polite, possibly because they weren’t confident in their English and wanted to avoid offending Jeremy. This applied to the teachers as well. Teachers would go out of their way to make

sure that Jeremy and his fellow exchange students felt comfortable and happy in the city.

The school that Jeremy attended, the Janáček Academy of Music and Performing Arts (JAMU), specialized in movement and dance oriented classes, so most of his classes involved some sort of dance. Jeremy



also took classes that focused on acting, Czech theatre, Czech language, and even a class on current American theatre that was taught by a visiting American professor. The classes were valuable and

enlightening, and Jeremy left with a greater understanding of how to use his body while performing. Despite Jeremy’s busy class schedule, he was able to visit several major cities around Europe including: Prague, Budapest, Vienna, Bratislava, and Krakow. Those trips were particular highlights of his experience.



Jeremy feels that he cannot overlook the racial aspect of the trip. The racial demographics of Czech Republic and the surrounding countries tend to be overwhelmingly white, so he was a novelty wherever he went, particularly in the smaller cities and towns that he visited. He received quite a few stares, but very few instances of outright racism. One such instance occurred when Jeremy, while visiting a small Czech village, attended

its annual Huntsman's Ball, and a man who sat next to him started taking pictures of Jeremy when he wasn't looking. The man was not an official photographer for the event, so Jeremy asked him if he'd like to take some pictures of him actually looking at the camera.

The man claimed that he couldn't speak English, however, people who knew

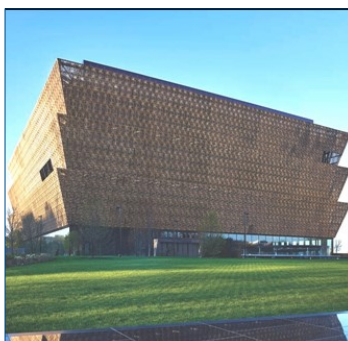


LT. COL. ALEX JEFFERSON

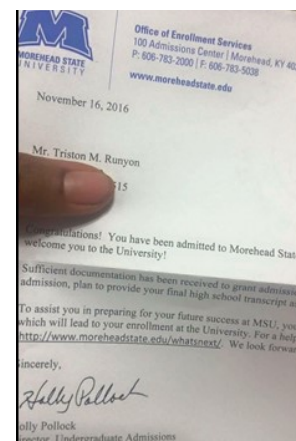

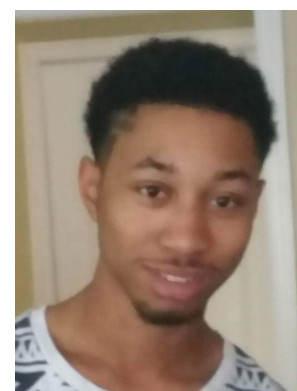

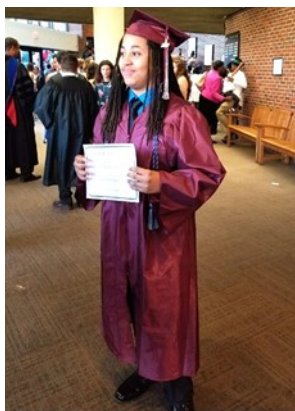

Lawn & Garden Hacks

During our retirement, Charley and I (Del) are adventuring into new and interesting things. So you might consider gardening as a hobby. See these six-awesome lawn and garden hacks:

1. Use newspaper to block weeds. Don't spend money on pricey weed-blocking cloth. Instead, take newspaper and spread it out where you are hoping to block weeds and/or start a new garden bed. Place dirt, mulch or grass clippings on top to keep the newspaper in place and to smother those weeds.
2. Spray cooking spray on your lawn mower to keep clumps of grass from clumping underneath.
3. DIY (do it yourself). Many swear by baking soda as a weed killer (and it should not hurt pets). There is another recipe that others have used: vinegar, dish soap and salt.
4. Make a sharp (yet safe) surface to keep critters out of your garden. There are two hacks that make gardens inhospitable to little paws yet safe overall. The first is to put plastic forks, tines up, in the ground around your seedlings. The other is to gather pine cones and use them as mulch.
5. Mix a natural critter repellant. You may love the smell of coffee, but supposedly animals do not. Some experts recommend sprinkling coffee grounds in your garden to keep critters at bay. Bonus: coffee grounds act as a natural fertilizer. Another critter repellant? Citrus peels.
6. Repurpose for your seedling starters. No need to buy little pots to start new seedlings. You can use an empty egg carton, a toilet paper tube, or a hollowed-out orange peel as your pot. Plus, when you're ready to plant those seedlings in the ground, those biodegradable seedling pots can go into the dirt, too.

I made this Peach Cobbler and it is delicious, an easy recipe for those who love peaches. This is one of **Charley Gillispie's** favorite desserts. ENJOY!!

Quick and Easy Peach Cobbler

1 ¾ lbs. fresh peaches (4 cups) *
½ cup (4 oz.) salted butter
1 cup self-rising flour **
1 cup granulated sugar
1 cup whole milk
1 tsp. vanilla extract ***

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Gently rub the peaches under running water to remove fuzz, then slice peaches.
2. Place butter in an 11 x 7-inch baking dish; place dish in oven until butter melts.
3. Stir together flour, sugar, milk, and vanilla in a bowl, and pour into melted butter. (Do not stir). Spoon peaches over mixture. (Do not stir).
4. Bake in preheated oven until brown and bubbly, 45 to 50 minutes
5. Let cool about 10 minutes before serving.

Note: * 2 - 16 oz. cans sliced peaches in heavy syrup can be substituted.

** Bisquick can be substituted.

*** Additional e: * spices can also be used, such as cinnamon and nutmeg

We have discovered several writings from Amie (Stephen & Allener Huguely Branch) Frances Huguely Gillispie, and we would like to share excerpts from copies of her works. Enjoy reading.

Youth Must Recognize Crisis – Meet it with Faith

"*Let not your heart be troubled*", the words of St. John 14 -1; spoken by Jesus to his disciples in a time of dictatorship, military occupation and cruelty; when torture was common, poverty and disease rampant, humanitarian endeavors almost nonexistent.

I. When the St. Paul Cathedral was built in London, Christopher Wren spent so much money on decorations that there were not enough left to construct substantial pillars. He therefore made the supporting columns hollow and filled them with rubbish.

HUGUELY REUNION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Purpose: The Huguely Reunion Scholarship Program was established to provide college tuition assistance to eligible high school seniors and undergraduate college students of the Reunion.

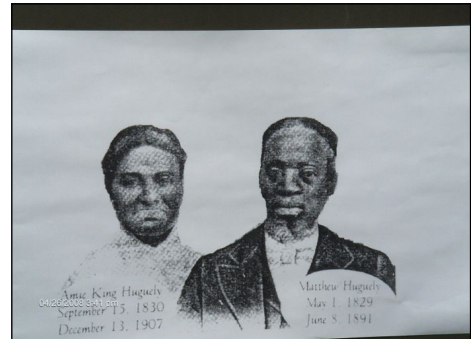
