STEPINTOHISTORY

A man from Ravenna, Ky., who works with the Estill County Historical Society saw the Huguely Furniture Sign on East Main Street in Richmond, Ky., and mailed the following to them. Lillian Jones and Beatrice Huguely thought this would be an interesting item to be put into our records.

The following article was published in the "IRVINE TIMES" on January 1, 1937.

" LAST CIVIL WAR VETERAN DIES "

"George Huguely, 93, colored, reputed to be the last Civil War veteran residing in Estill County, succumbed at his home on Back Street December 24, after a long illness due to dropsy.

"Uncle George" as he was known to both white and colored people of Irvine was born in Madison County, but moved to Millers Creek about seventy years ago, later moving to Irvine. In his life time he was sold as a slave, bringing a high price.

His wife, Nancy Crawford Huguely, died about eight years ago. He is survived by five daughters, Mrs. Joe Parks, Mrs. Tom Bates, Mrs. Lee Hume, and Mrs. Frankie Hightower, of Irvine, and Mrs. Roger Willis of LaFayette, Indiana. One son Henry Collins Huguely, of Moberly, Madison County, Kentucky."

Many thanks to Lil and Bea for this enlightening bit of news.

This reveals to us that the Huguely Family was writing its name in the sands of time over a hundred years ago.
